Become a volunteer park ranger for National Parks and Wildlife Service SA

Ever wanted to help behind the scenes at some of South Australia's most iconic National Parks? Applications are now open in SA's regions for the National Parks and Wildlife Service South Australia (NPWSSA) Volunteer Ranger Program, giving participants the chance to help out in some of South Australia's most unique and beautiful parks.

Volunteer rangers are currently being sought in the Eyre Peninsula and Far West, Riverland and Murraylands, Southern Yorke Peninsula, lower South East and Kangaroo Island areas.

Volunteer rangers provide practical and focused hands-on service by supporting park conservation and wildlife, as well as ensuring park visitors have a safe and memorable experience. They help with everything from taking visitors on guided walks through to pest, plant and animal control, undertaking wildlife surveys, trail marking, facilities maintenance and more.

NPWSSA Executive Director Mike Williams said he wanted to build upon the success of the program, which celebrated a significant milestone in October 2020, with 100 volunteer rangers being appointed in the program.

"The South Australian Volunteer Ranger Program provides an opportunity for South Australians with a passion for the environment to get involved in activities that help support the management of our parks and reserves and connect people to nature," he said.

"We want to improve visitor experiences and increase the number of people who can enjoy our parks across South Australia and volunteer park rangers play a crucial role in this.

"We are looking to continue to build a strong network of volunteer rangers across the state, so I encourage all interested applicants to apply."

Participation is flexible according to regional requirements. It may be a once a week commitment, or small blocks of time. Activities may sometimes be for a single volunteer ranger or for a group of volunteer rangers.

The program is currently

run across multiple national parks in South Australia, including Glenthorne National Park-Ityamaiitpinna Dhilba Guuranda-Innes National Park, Flinders Chase National Park, Ikara-Flinders Ranges National Park and Mount Remarkable National

Mt Pleasant Farmers Market Triumph



The well-loved southern Barossa Mt Pleasant Farmers Market will celebrate their ninth birthday this month, triumphing over the many challenges faced in the previous

"The Market has faced many challenges over its nine years and 2020 was no different with the market overcoming adversity through the pandemic. Market consumers saw the evolution of the market online store and covid compliant structural renovations within the market hall. With major shifts in food-linked perceptions, the market observed new consumer behaviours and preferences, with records reflecting the change by a notable increase in membership," said Market Manager Genevieve Hebart

"With Adelaide hills fires & COVID-19 requiring cancellation of three of the major events in the market calendar. the Christmas, Easter twilight markets and the SA Spring Garden Festival, the market management thought 'outside the square' with a new initiative, the September Spring Fling," explained Marketing Manager Terese Stephens

To comply with covid crowd regulations, the very popular one day event, the SA Spring Garden Festival was changed to a four-day event, operating every Saturday in September. The market outdoor area was filled with a diverse range of all things gar-

This enterprising market initiative was rewarded with a 2020 Australia Day award for Event of the Year. "For the innovative way they overcame obstacles to bring a great event to our community," said Paula Bartsch, Chairperson Mt Pleasant Community Organisation Inc.

The markets ongoing gate fundraising initiative for community groups has resulted in a total of \$140,000 over nine years, going back into our region to grow the good works of those groups. Terese explained, "The money is raised through an optional on-site parking donation, a gold coin which is collected every Saturday at the Market gate. The Market links with a number of community groups - schools, charities, and other local interests - who spend their Saturday mornings collecting at the market gates to boost their fundraising efforts."

In April the market will be preparing for their very popular annual Easter Twilight Market, showcasing a smorgasbord of the region's best producers. The ever-popular twilight market is an important drawcard to the region, with

ample opportunity to purchase locally produced foods in a festival atmosphere.

"From small beginnings the market continues to grow," Terese says, "putting the township of Mount Pleasant on the map as a place to seek out and visit, and to enjoy the tastes of the Mount Pleasant Farmers Market. It also provides opportunity for the local community to shop local and support local. Many of our stallholders, family owned and run, have reported that their businesses have flourished in the last 9 years under the Farmer's Market banner. It is a win-win for the community".

The Mount Pleasant Farmers Market is held every Saturday, 8am to 12 noon at the Mount Pleasant Showgrounds.

The Electoral Districts Boundaries Commission has abandoned its draft order to carve-up the seat of Kavel after a spirited grass-roots campaign.

The draft order would have seen localities in Kavel south of the Freeway, including the Hills largest township and commercial centre, Mount Barker, shifted into the State seat of Hammond which includes Murray Bridge and areas East of the Murray River.

Member for Kavel, Dan Cregan MP, said a grass-roots campaign opposing the changes had led to the Commission dumping its draft boundaries in the Hills.

"From the outset we argued that the changes were a radical departure from the principles which govern the drawing of electoral boundaries and we requested a special hearing on that basis.'

"Without the strong grassroots campaign opposing the changes, I doubt the Commission would have acted."

"I am deeply grateful for the overwhelming community support we received. Many volunteers spent hours collecting signatures. I want to particularly acknowledge Mayor Ann for her outstanding help."

Community Campaign Saves Central Hills Seat

A large number of individual submissions were received by the Commission concerning the changes proposed to Kavel and a petition was presented to the Commission by Mr Cregan.

The final Kavel boundaries will see Mount Barker remain in Kavel but Hahndorf and surrounding areas shifted into Heysen. Areas South of Mount Barker, including the Bugle Ranges and Wistow, will be included in Kavel. To the North, the township of Lobethal and the localities of Lenswood and Forest Range will be included in Kavel - these areas were excluded by the last redistribution.

'Overall, the vast majority of existing electors in Kavel will stay in Kavel," Mr Cregan said.

"I am looking forward to welcoming Lobethal and surrounding areas back into the seat - we have been working very closely with these communities after the Cudlee Creek bushfire so I feel it is a natural and very positive inclusion," Mr Cregan added.

COMMUNITY SOLAR STORAGE - HOW DOES IT WORK?

Community batteries are a shared neighbourhood battery solution where solar energy can be stored and retrieved. They offer an alternative to individual households purchasing their own battery storage system, saving them money and improving the level of clean energy supply in the grid.

A community battery, like any valuable shared asset, also has the potential for wider community benefits. In Australia, there is widespread interest in community-scale storage, with several trial projects underway. There are many community batteries already being developed, designed, or in use in Australia, and early feedback from trials around Australia are reporting positive outcomes for community batteries. Users are pleased with the benefits, and the access to renewable energy and storage without the sizable price outlay from the outset.

If you are confused about all the talk on community solar storage, then you need to come to a short introduction to this topic that will help you understand the different aspects of a community solar storage and a virtual power plant, plus pose any other solar power related questions you may have.






