

"My body and mind may fail, but you are my strength and my choice forever." Psalm 73:26CEV.

St Augustine gave this advice: "Take care of your body as if you were going to live forever; and take care of your soul as if you were going to die tomorrow." And he goes on to give further insight into the human experience by asserting that: "to fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek him the greatest adventure; to find him, the greatest human achievement."

The Ligonier Ministries website offers insight into some of the realities of human love: "For as 1 John 4:19 tells us, 'we love because he first loved us.' It is the effectual love of God that first changes our hearts in order to make us capable of love, and it is His example of love that reminds us again and again of our need to love other people."

There seems to be a general agree-

ment regarding the importance of loving relationships for children and adults and the potentially detrimental health consequences for people who experience loneliness and social isolation. Love is described as a 'doing' word so that we demonstrate our love for others in the things we do or do not do. And Romans 13:8 encourages us to, "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law."

"Faith in God has not saved people from hardships and trials, but it has enabled them to bear tribulations courageously and to emerge victoriously", stated Lee Roberson. Sometimes loving others may require courage: Churchill is quoted as saying that, "courage is rightly esteemed the first of human qualities because it has been said, it is the quality which guarantees all others."

Jesus demonstrated both love and

courage when he went to the cross of Calvary to redeem those who come to Him in faith and repentance. He fulfilled the purpose for which He came to earth and made possible the reconciliation between self-seeking, imperfect human beings and a holy and loving God.

In his explanation of Hebrews 9:22, Jeremy Myers explains: "through the Mosaic covenant, the people of Israel died to their old identification as slaves... and were raised again to a new identification as members of the household of God ... the death of Jesus on the cross was to inaugurate the new covenant of God with the entire world, and to indicate to all people that we were no longer slaves to sin." Hebrews 9:27-28 states, "Just as man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgement, so Christ was sacrificed once to take away the sins of many people..." Evidence, we believe, of God's love, because we matter to God.

This group of marvellous volunteers have put a lot of time and effort into the community and were recognised at this year's Quiet Green Achievers Awards, at the Hills Environment Centre in Norton Summit. They were specifically acknowledged for the work they've done on Station Road (Woodside) at the Woody Trails Bike Park and community garden.

Over the past three years, Love Woodside have planted a community garden that includes vegies, flowers, fruit trees and native bees. They have just completed a native bee hotel and already have lodgers! Shrubs were planted around the Council storm water retention ponds, including bush tucker plants (donated by Ade-

laide Hills Toyota). These plants encourage more native bees, honey bees, and frogs to the area. Love Woodside hope the area will attract many visitors who can get ideas to use in their own back yards. The work done on the Station Road site was made possible with kind donations from members of the community and many hours put in by the wonderful volunteers. There are so many other local projects that Love Woodside are involved in, such as decorating the township for the Tour Down Under in 2019 (awarded 2^{nd} prize) and 2020 (awarded 1^{st} prize); the Red Poppy project for Anzac and Remembrance days (community helped by knitting, crochet, sewing and making banners); and only last week, members worked with the Woodside Commerce group to clean the Main Street's footpaths and gutters.






The Kersbrook Soldiers Memorial Park is celebrating the 100 year anniversary of the Park gates on November 11th, 2021.

Research about the Red Cross Bushfire Recovery Program

Seeking residents of Adelaide Hills Council to discuss their experience of the Red Cross Bushfire Recovery Program.

Our team at the University of Melbourne has been commissioned to conduct an external evaluation of the Red Cross Bushfire Recovery Program. This research seeks to understand how the Red Cross can best support communities impacted by bushfires; what works in the current recovery program; and what could be improved.

In the **Adelaide Hills**, we are hoping to speak with service providers and community members who have engaged with the Red Cross.

What does it involve?

• An interview or focus group discussion (30-60 min), in person or online.

• We will ask about experience of bushfire recovery in your community and experiences you have had with Red Cross.

• Results from the research will be shared with all par-

ticipants at the end of the project. Results will also be shared with Red Cross in an anonymous format (participants not identified), to strengthen future program development.


