The Old Testament prophet, Isaiah, between around 740BC and 681BC, prophesied to the inhabitants of Judah. In chapter 40:28-31 (ESV) he reassured the people: “Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their

strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.” Michael Jakes at Biblestudytools.com makes the following comment on these verses: “mounting up with wings as eagles, gives us a “God’s eye-view” of our circumstance.

It causes us to see things from a different perspective and prevents the difficult times from overpowering or overwhelming us. I believe that God always wants us to be in forward motion... We are never to retreat; we are to stand still and see

what He will do, but this is not retreating; it is waiting expectantly. As we wait on Him in this way, there is nothing we cannot do. Waiting teaches us to trust Him – even in the direst conditions.”

In Isaiah 40:10 we read: “See, the Sovereign Lord comes with power, and his arm rules for him. See, his reward is with him, and his recompense accompanies him.”

The writer to the Hebrews in 9:28 affirms: “So Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are

eagerly waiting for him.” And Jesus’ words are recorded for us in John 6:39-40 (ESV): “And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day.”

To explain one aspect of waiting for the Lord, Alexander Maclaren (1826-1910) stated: “The apostolic church thought more about the Second Coming of Jesus Christ than

about death and heaven. The early Christians were looking, not for a cleft in the ground called a grave but for a cleavage in the sky called Glory. They were watching not for the undertaker but for the upper taker.”

Psalms 25:5 states: “Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour, and my hope is in you all day long.” We believe that those who come in faith and trust to Jesus are wonderfully blessed, and that Jesus keeps His promises, and that we all matter to Him.

You may not think about it all the time, but do you ever consider that there is a whole ecosystem beneath your feet, and its health and vitality is directly correlated to our own?


That's right, it's soil! The biology and management of soil is one of the key elements to food production and overall land management - it deserves to be celebrated!

New Mobile Library on the move

The Adelaide Hills Council has launched its new Mobile Library as it retires the original mobile library after 20 years of service.

"The mobile library is an important service for our community, providing access to library materials for borrowers across the Adelaide Hills Council area. It complements our physical branches in Woodside, Gumeracha and Stirling by bringing the library to smaller townships and community hubs," says Jess Charlton, Manager Libraries and Customer Service.

"Customers will still be able to come on board the van and browse the collection. Now the library inside the van is solar powered and the van itself has wheelchair access."

The new Iveco Daily van will house approximately 1000 items - including fiction, non-fiction, children's books, magazines and DVDs, with the curated collection being updated

regularly depending on upcoming stops.

Customers are able to reserve items from across the State Library network and pick them up from their nearest mobile library public stop. Staff will also be available to assist borrowers with digital resources including eBooks, eAudiobooks and eMagazines.

The refreshed timetable will operate on a four week cycle, with public stops at key community hubs and townships.

New stops include the Uraidla main street, Balhannah oval and playground and a return to the Mount Torrens main street and Mylor main street.

In addition to public stops, the Mobile Library will be visiting schools, kindergartens, early-learning centre, aged care facilities and retirement villages.

The latest 2022 schedule is available online with the 2023 schedule to be released this December.



\$1.3 million fund to restore native woodlands in the Hills and Fleurieu

A new \$1.3 million grant fund is now available for revegetation projects to restore native woodland habitats across Adelaide's Hills and Fleurieu region.

The Native Vegetation Council is running the grant program and is encouraging NGOs, organisations and land holders to develop large impact projects.

Manager Native Vegetation with the Department for Environment and Water Sarah Reachill explained that the native woodlands that once covered the Mount Lofty Ranges landscape have been reduced to a tenth of their former extent.

"Woodlands in the Hill and Fleurieu region are important in providing habitat

for the state's unique flora and fauna and this dramatic loss of woodlands has had devastating implications for the many native birds that depend on it for survival," Sarah said.

"We know that many birds disappear when more than 70 per cent of the woodland is destroyed. Bird diversity can rapidly decline if 90 per cent of the habitat is destroyed.

"This funding program is about off-setting that loss in native vegetation and start rebuilding that much needed habitat for native birds and other native species.

"A monitoring program in the region has observed a decrease in small-bodied woodland birds such as the diamond firetail, superb fairy

wren and spotted pardalote.

"Meanwhile, there's been an increase in large, native birds that don't rely on woodland habitat such as the little corella, Australian magpie and little raven.

"This native vegetation funding complements the State Government's efforts to tackle biodiversity loss and threatened species recovery."

Sarah explained the grants are available for projects the run over multiple years and are valued between \$100,000 and the full \$1.3 million, meaning the funding maybe awarded to one or more applicants.

The grant is for large scale restoration across sites at least 10 hectares in size.


